



1. These terms and conditions are the Lottery Rules. By entering the lottery, entrants agree to be bound by these rules
2. This lottery is being promoted by and on behalf of St Peter's Hospice
3. For the purpose of the Gambling Act 2005, this lottery is defined as a 'Society Lottery'
4. This lottery is licensed by the Gambling Commission
5. To enter the lottery, you must be a UK resident aged 16 (sixteen) or over
6. There will be 11 guaranteed weekly winners, and 11 cash prizes
7. There will be 1 £1,000 guaranteed weekly cash winner and 10 x £10 cash prizes
8. In each lottery draw, an additional £150 will be added to the rollover pot. The lottery software will randomly determine whether or not the rollover prize will be given out. If a rollover prize is to be won during a draw, it will effectively add an extra cash prize into the main lottery draw, so in that week there will be 12 winners and 12 cash prizes. Should the rollover pot reach a total of £5,100, the rollover pot will be won in the very next lottery draw
9. All tickets shall be priced at £1
10. All lottery entry sales are final and no refunds shall be made at any time. All entrants acknowledge that their payment of £1 per ticket to enter the lottery does not guarantee that they will win any prize
11. The draw for the prizes will normally be held every Friday, unless public holidays disturb this, the draw will then be held on the next working day (Mon-Fri). You do not need to be present at the draw to win the lottery
12. If a cash prize is awarded, this will be made by cheque in the name of the entrant only
13. Full payment for each ticket must be received either in the form of cash or cleared funds before the ticket can be entered into the draw. Only tickets for which full payment has been received either in the form of cash or cleared funds is eligible to win the prize
14. The winners of the lottery prizes will be notified by letter
15. All entrants are solely responsible for providing St Peter's Hospice with their accurate and up-to-date contact details and St Peter's Hospice will be in no way liable for any failure or inability to contact any entrant due to any errors, omissions or inaccuracies in the contact details that the entrant has provided. In the event that an entrant changes their contact details, they will be solely responsible for advising St Peter's Hospice of the change. It is the responsibility of the Lotto player to make St Peter's Hospice aware of a change of address or contact details
16. Where a winner is uncontactable, has an incorrect address on file or does not cash a winner's cheque within 6 months the cheque will be cancelled by St Peter's Hospice
17. By accepting the prize, the winner agrees to take part in promotional activity and St Peter's Hospice reserves the right to use the name and address of the winner, their photograph and audio and/or visual recordings of them in any publicity unless prior notification has been received
18. Each game number is unique. A randomly selected game number will be issued with the confirmation of entry. Any member may subsequently request an alternative game number if they wish at any time and this will be issued providing that it has not already been allocated to an existing member
19. Lottery membership can be cancelled at any time by notifying St Peter's Hospice in writing, by phone or via e-mail
20. St Peter's Hospice shall not be liable to the member for any loss or damage suffered or arising from:-

- any delays or failures in the postal service or other delivery methods used by St Peter's Hospice or the member from time to time
- any delays or failures in any software or other systems used by St Peter's Hospice for the administration of the lottery
- any delays or failures in the Banking system used by St Peter's Hospice or the member
- any refusal by St Peter's Hospice to accept registration of an individual as a member or the cancellation of a member
- any failure to enter a chance into the draw
- any event beyond the reasonable control of St Peter's Hospice

Nothing within these terms and conditions shall create or should be construed as creating any form of contract between any entrant and St Peter's Hospice

21. Any complaints relating to the lottery should be sent in writing to St Peter's Hospice giving full details of the complaint and supporting documentation
22. St Peter's Hospice is committed to protecting the member's privacy. Data that is collected from the member is used lawfully in accordance with the General Data Protection Act. You can read our privacy policy on the St Peter's Hospice website for more information on how we use and protect personal information.
23. Any member has the right to access the information held about them. To obtain this information, please contact St Peter's Hospice in writing
24. In the event of any dispute regarding the rules, the decision of St Peter's Hospice shall be final and no correspondence or discussion shall be entered into
25. St Peter's Hospice reserves the right to amend these rules at any time. If St Peter's Hospice does this, it will publish the amended rules on the St Peter's Hospice website
26. St Peter's Hospice reserves the right to disqualify any entrant if it has reasonable grounds to believe the entrant has breached any of these rules
27. The St Peter's Hospice member responsible for the promotion of the lottery is Jayne Clarke
28. Each entrant is encouraged to visit the St Peter's Hospice website to review any updates to these T&Cs
29. This lottery is a form of gambling. Participants are encouraged to gamble sensibly
